It is my pleasure to provide this report on behalf of the Silent Voice Board of Directors. I would first like to thank all the Board members for their efforts and support of Silent Voice Canada over the past year. It is a pleasure to serve alongside such expertise and active engagement.

At the 2024 Annual General Meeting, we must say goodbye to three Board members who are stepping back from the Board to focus on their respective work and family commitments. We give heartfelt thanks to Brandon Goure, Board Secretary, as well as Dr. Jenelle Rouse and Nicolle Lehn. We are sorry to lose you, but it is great to know that this is not a permanent goodbye; we look forward to your

return when your lives allow and, of course, to seeing your faces at future Silent Voice events. A token of our appreciation has been sent to each of you in gratitude for your commitment, contribution, and continued support of Silent Voice Canada.



You may have seen reports in the news that COVID has not gone away, and there are still ongoing surges of the infection as it has become a fixture in our public health environment. So, it should be no surprise that COVID continues to influence the operation and direction of all organizations, with Silent Voice Canada included. You will recall from the 2022 and 2023 AGM reports that the strategic plan continues to be focused on five key points.

The key focuses continue to be:

- **1. COVID-19 recovery** navigating the new normal.
- **2. Programming** continuing to meet the needs of clients and families under new financial pressures.
- **3. Funding & Ability to Grow** seeking opportunities to support and grow Silent Voice Canada infrastructure, and its programs, services, and resources to the community.
- **4. Public Profile** growing the reputation as the go-to agency for services, expertise, and resources in the Canadian Deaf community.
- **5. Sustainability** ensuring Silent Voice Canada is positioned to continue to thrive.



Silent Voice Canada continues to fine-tune the virtual aspects of our services in a continuing evolution of the agency. Programming continues to be a fluid area and changes in the funding environment put a sharper focus on the programs that we continue to provide and refine. Reductions in spending are a theme that impacts our fee-for-service and fundraising efforts, as there is caution everywhere about spending in these uncertain times.

Therefore, on the financial front, the fiscal year 2023-24 was challenging, and we did not hit the forecast revenue for the agency. Funding has been reduced, and donations were down across the entire not-for-profit charitable environment and reflected in a deficit for the year. This deficit was both anticipated and approved. Working closely with Silent Voice Canada Executive Director Kelly MacKenzie, we have dipped into the reserve funds that have been

strengthened in the past several years rather than lose valuable and qualified staff during what may be temporary precarious times. Along with Kelly, we continue to monitor our financial stability as you will see from Board Treasurer Ian Edmonds in this report. Though there have been challenges this year, the team has continued to deliver the services that the community needs and appreciates.

I also want to acknowledge that aside from delivering the daily programs, Silent Voice continues to be a presence in so many other ways, Catholic Agencies Committee meetings, community events like Mayfest, London Deaf Expo, and many more, as well as running a Food Bank that includes diapers, clothing, toys, and more, and

delivering local school presentations. A sixth strategic objective for fiscal year 2023-24 has also been preparing to host the Canada Deaf Games in May 2024. A huge thanks to the organizing committee and volunteers, and to George Postlethwaite, who led the sponsorship efforts for the Games. It is hard not to report on the Games now, but they did not take place until fiscal year 2024-25 and we are reporting on 2023-24. More to come in next year's impact report.

On the subject of activities and events, a big thank-you to all those who continue to participate and support Silent Voice in the TCS Toronto Waterfront Marathon. In 2023 we participated for the 13th year and raised more than \$25,000. We are looking forward to another successful showing in October 2024!

Our other hugely successful annual program at Silent Voice is the Holiday Hamper initiative. Last year was a great success, and it continues to grow every year. Again, many thanks to our corporate and individual supporters and to the many hands that made it happen.

Message from Ian Edmonds, Treasurer

As the Treasurer on the Board of Directors, it is my responsibility to report as summary of the fiscal year for Silent Voice Canada ending March 31, 2024. A copy of the Audited Financial Statements is available upon request and is posted on the Silent Voice website at www.silentvoice.ca. A summary of the financial results from the Audited Financial Statements can also be found in this Annual Impact Report on page 11.

Fiscal year 2023-24 was a challenging year, due primarily for three reasons:

- The new post-COVID economic environment locally and globally,
- government and corporations cautiously spending and in fact pulling back, and,
- the dramatic increase in the cost of goods and services the cost of living that we all have experienced.

I am happy to report that Silent Voice maintained its programs, services, and resources to the community. Its revenues were \$2.5 million for the year, up 3% over the previous year.

However, its expenses, as with everyone else's, grew more rapidly, ending the year with a deficit of \$130,000. This was both anticipated and forecasted by the Board, working closely with the Executive Director Kelly MacKenzie, in unprecedented post-COVID times.

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Thank you to Silent Voice for helping me with my resume and interview skills. Their guidance was invaluable, and I'm proud to say that I was able to get a job at Amazon! Silent Voice's employment services played a crucial role in my success.

I want to thank Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Toronto for not only their continued core and essential funding and support, but also their shared services for health benefits and pension to our staff, shared HR, IT, and Financial Management services, evaluations consultation, and professional development, its network of agencies and more. All government and specially earmarked funding was spent as directed - on the programs and services we offer. Silent Voice has a fiscally responsible team led by Kelly. The key financial resource for Silent Voice continues to be funding from our generous supporters – including government agencies, at all three levels. We would like to thank the City of Toronto as well as Provincial and Federal governments, for their partnership in enabling us to provide services to members of the Deaf community and the community at large.

Our auditor has performed an independent review of the financial results for fiscal year 2023-24. Consistent with prior years, we have been provided a positive opinion on the financial results which is normal and expected for a charitable organization such as Silent Voice.

As members of the agency, funders, and stakeholders, you should feel confident that the agency is being properly managed as it delivers programs, services, and resources to the community, and that the finance committee of the Board is working closely with Kelly to ensure agency sustainability.

1,644 individuals served

- That doesn't count the thousands of times they connect with us to get services or the many programs they access.

- That doesn't include social media views, visits to the Deaf Youth Hub, learners in the 258 Hub, or the 50,000 users of our website.
- That doesn't include our many valued partners and our outreach and community education.

- Families in the Ontario Government Infant Hearing Program ASL services across the province receiving early intervention language development services.
- Families learning ASL in the Family Communication Program because their child is Deaf and uses ASL.
- Children and youth who come to our camps, our Saturday program, our family events, and the students we meet in their schools, and the mentors and role models they meet to develop skills.
- Individuals who receive community support services, employment services, and settlement services.
- Individuals and families who access the tax clinic, the diaper bank, clothing bank, and food bank.
- Seniors who come to hang out with us and with peers to combat isolation.
- Parents who get connected to fellow parents and parenting education.

In fiscal year 2023-24, we prepared to host the Canada Deaf Games in May 2024, and hundreds of athletes, fans, families, and visitors came to Toronto to enjoy the Games along with Mayfest and Deaffest. More on that amazing event next year! Also, next year, we are turning 50! I hope you come to celebrate with us in May 2025.

This year, we are participating again in the TCS Toronto Waterfront Marathon, so please consider sponsoring me or the team! Every bit makes a huge difference. In fact, in these uncertain times, we need all your support.
